- i) Describe the appearance of the goddess of justice.
- ii) On which day of the week did the Great Fire of London break out? How do you know that from Pepys' text?
- iii) "Till the *conversion of the Jews*" Explain the underlined phrase.
- iv) Who is invoked in the beginning of *The Rape of the lock*? Why?
- v) Mention any two books written by Mary Astell
- vi) Briefly describe Rochester's portrait in the National Portrait Gallery.
- vii) Mention any two of the influences on Thomson's *The Seasons*.

- viii) How according to Johnson does an idling painter spend his time?
- ix) Briefly mention the subject of any two of the paintings by William Hogarth.
- x) Briefly state Astell's opinion on the importance of income in considerations of a marriage.
- xi) What was the result of "Act of an Union"? When did it come into effect?
- xii) Why was the Botany Bay colony established?
- xiii) What are the two meanings of the word 'retreat' in the title of Henry Vaughan's poem?
- xiv) Why were the Pre-Romantics called so?
- B. Answer any **seven** of the following questions : $5 \times 7 = 35$
 - i) Locate and annotate:"This is a new mouse-trap, and he that will come into the press must expect to be catch'd in it."
 - ii) Apart from providing the reader with the preliminary facts of Gulliver's life, what textual role does the introductory paragraph of *Gulliver's Travels* serve?
 - iii) State the Doctor's case and the promise in the Prologue to *She Stoops to Conquer*.

- iv) Locate and annotate:
 "Far from the madding crowd's ignoble strife
 Their sober wishes never learn'd to stray
 Along the cool sequester'd vale of life
 They kept the noiseless tenor of their way."
- v) Write a short note on Steele's contribution as a periodical essayist.
- vi) "... women would marry more and *demean* themselves better in a married state than some people say they do." What does 'demean' mean here? What according to the author will bring about more discretion in a woman's position in marriage?
- vii) Explain and comment on Dr Johnson's definition of 'sensibility' in his Dictionary.
- viii) Locate and annotate :

 "Thou by the Indian Ganges' side
 Shouldst rubies find".
- ix) Comment on situational irony in *She* Stoops to Conquer.
- x) Explain and comment: "Troth, Sir, nothing but what was concealed from myself".
- C) Answer the following questions: $15 \times 3 = 45$
 - i) Which state of contemporary comedy were Goldsmith and Sheridan criticizing? Do you think *She Stoops to Conquer* is successful in reviving the gaeity and wit while deleting

the indecency of Restoration Comedy? Substantiate with textual reference.

- ii) Fielding's Parson Adams found Steele's *The Conscious Lovers* "almost sober enough for a sermon.' Do you think such an estimate to be justified? Substantiate with close textual reference to the play as a sentimental comedy.
- iii) Write an essay on the symbolic use of the Liliputians and the Brobdingnagians in *Gulliver's Travels* 15

- iv) With close textual reference, show how *Gulliver's Travels* converts the existing accounts of voyage and discovery to a Satiric use.
- v) With close textual reference to Thomas Gray's 'Elegy', show how common life can serve as a fit subject for poetry.

vi) What does the term 'metaphysical' in metaphysical poetry mean? With close textual reference to any one of the poems in your syllabus, analyse it as a metaphysical poem. 5+10=15
