1. Read the passage carefully and answer the following questions:

If you want to make the most of yourself, then you must have courage. This means that you must be able to do brave things even though you tremble with fear, while you are going to do them. If you are afraid to speak before others, you must persist in doing so until you are no longer afraid. Doing a thing which you are afraid to do often helps you to overcome your fear. If you fear other persons, you may overcome your fear by bravely facing them. Courageous persons overcome senseless fears.

Of course, it is silly to try to overcome fears that keep us from destroying overselves. You are afraid of an automobile coming rapidly down the street as you wish to cross. You wait until it is out of the way before crossing. This is sensible. You need some fears to keep you from doing foolish things. The only fears, you need to avoid, are silly fears which prevent you from doing what you should do.

Some people have a great many silly fears. These make them a nuisance to themselves and others. Fear of the dark is one of lurked in the dark forest to pounce upon any one who went abroad at night. But today, with lighted streets, good police service, telephone and radio, there is little need to be afraid of the dark. Each of us needs to master such a foolish fear.
