Brief Description:

Brief Description:

HIV (human immunodeficiency virus) is a virus that attacks cells that help the body fight infection, making a person more vulnerable to other infections and diseases. It is spread by contact with certain bodily fluids of a person with HIV, most commonly during unprotected sex (sex without a condom or HIV medicine to prevent or treat HIV), or through sharing injection drug equipment. If left untreated, HIV can lead to the disease AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome). The human body can't get rid of HIV and no effective HIV cure exists. So, once you have HIV, you have it for life. Luckily, however, effective treatment with HIV medicine (called antiretroviral therapy or ART) is available. If taken as prescribed, HIV medicine can reduce the amount of HIV in the blood (also called the viral load) to a very low level. This is called viral suppression. If a person's viral load is so low that a standard lab can't detect it, this is called having an undetectable viral load. People with HIV who take HIV medicine as prescribed and get and keep an undetectable viral load can live long and healthy lives and will not transmit HIV to their HIV-negative partners through sex. Like every year NSS Unit has observed Red Ribbon Day on World AIDS Day by organizing seminar/ symposium etc. In this year NSS unit, S.R.F College organized a seminar on “Current Trends in Diagnosis, Prevention and Management of HIV” to aware the threat among people. One-day college-level seminar on *Women Empowerment and The Indian State* has been organized by the Department of Political Science on 20th June 2020. This seminar has been conducted through online mode via Google Meet. 40 Students participated in this online seminar. Mr. Biswanath Sarkar, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, Khalisani Mahavidyalaya, Hooghly has been invited to deliver the lecture. He said, that as India progresses economically, there are calls for the country to pay more attention to social and human development, including women's empowerment. After that he started to define women's empowerment as efforts that include advocating for women's and girl's human rights, combating discriminatory practices and challenging the roles and stereotypes that create inequalities and exclusion. Women's empowerment is a critical aspect to achieving gender equality, where both men and women have equal power and opportunities for education, healthcare, economic participation and personal development. India's journey towards women empowerment has its share of highs and lows. It has made gains by ratifying international conventions and formulating domestic policies intended to end gender inequality. The government has created the space for international agencies to work with state governments, local non-government organisations and private corporations on a plethora of projects to support women from different socio-economic backgrounds. Despite these efforts, India's ranking on global surveys of gender equality has not improved significantly over the years. Equal rights for men and women are enshrined under Articles 14 to 16 in the Indian constitution, which came into effect on 26 January 1950. Discrimination based on gender is


strictly prohibited. Indian women received universal suffrage during India's independence in 1947, long before several Western countries granted women the right to vote. India was the second country in modern history to have a female leader, Indira Gandhi, in 1966 after another South Asian state, Sri Lanka, elected Sirimavo Bandaranaike in 1960. New Delhi has also taken a concerted effort to ratify key international conventions to end discrimination against women. The Women's Reservation Bill gives 33 per cent reservation for women seats in all levels of Indian politics. This is an attempt to increase female political participation. Women in India are emerging in all sectors, including politics, business, medicine, sports and agriculture. History was made when two female scientists from the Indian Space Research Organisation led the country's second lunar mission Chandrayaan-2 from its inception to completion in 2019. India's journey on women empowerment and gender equality started when it became a sovereign state in 1947. While visible gains have been made through legal reforms, human development and grassroots initiatives, New Delhi still has a long way to go in many areas of women empowerment. A more concerted effort is needed to close the urban-rural divide and ensure that women in rural areas enjoy the same access to education, employment, healthcare and decision-making as their urban counterparts. After the presentation students have been allowed to ask questions. Overall, this online seminar has been proved a successful one.

Brief Description

One-day National level Webinar on Women & Human Rights: New Dynamics Has been organized by the Department of Political Science, on 8th March 2022. This webinar has been organized to celebrate the International Women’s Day. Dr. Swati Chakraborty, Assistant Professor, Institute of Legal Studies and Research & Deputy Director, Centre for Human Rights, Law and Justice, GLA University, Mathura and Founder of Web Platform 4 Dialogue has been invited to deliver the lecture. In her 1-hour lecture, she has touched upon several issues. Women since ancient times have remained to be the gender which is dominated by the male society. Apart from the day-to-day restrictions imposed upon them practices such as polygamy, sati, child marriage, and dowry further added to their oppression. With the drastic increase witnessed in various forms of violence against women, Mahatma Gandhi in the 20th Century came up with the National Movement for the Liberalization of Women. Alongside came movements started by learned persons such as Rajaram Mohan Roy and Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar who focused on the education of women, the prevention of the sati system and restraining polygamy. Sati Prevention Act, 1987, Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 and Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961 were introduced as the result of the struggles. After this came laws such as the Hindu Marriage Act, of 1955, which made monogamy a rule, Hindu Succession (Amendment) Act, of 2005, where the women got their due share in the property. After all the struggle and oppression faced by the women, these legislations came in as toddler steps towards liberalisation and fetching an equal share of rights. The coming of the women into the professional field or getting their due share of rights under the various personal laws, came in as a drastic change for the society, something which couldn’t be easily put into effect. The National Crime Records Bureau reveals that the total number of crimes committed in the nation was reported to be 3,886 per million in the year 2017.

However, during the same period, a total of 3.5 lakh cases were registered as crimes committed against women and included crimes such as rape, kidnapping, abduction, dowry death, acid attacks, cruelty against women, murder etc. To date movements such as #MeToo have gained momentum to enforce the human rights of women which is an indication of the fact that a lot remains to be done in this regard. At the same time, bringing in legislation to enforce the industrial rights of women such the maternity leave, pay etc becomes essential. Despite the evolution of the National and International framework regulating VAW including CEDAW, various Charters, etc., and increased awareness of sexual violence against women, the world has not seen any change or reduction in the rates of crimes against women. The data mentioned above clearly illustrates the areas where the law seems inadequate, for example, in the cases of non-stranger sexual assault crimes; or the sexual assault by a husband over his wife, in the sanctum of a man's castle, where for a long time we have been inadequately troubled by the law's reluctance to intervene. Once a crime of sexual violence against women has been committed, it reiterates the fact that all the measures of combating and stalling violence have failed. The voices for bringing legislation to enhance punishment are largely not sufficient and merely an expression of helplessness and frustration. New dynamics are emerging in this sphere. After her presentation participants were permitted to raise questions. Our resource person has tried her best to clear the doubts raised by participants. The Department of Political Science is thankful to her for sharing her valuable knowledge with the participants.

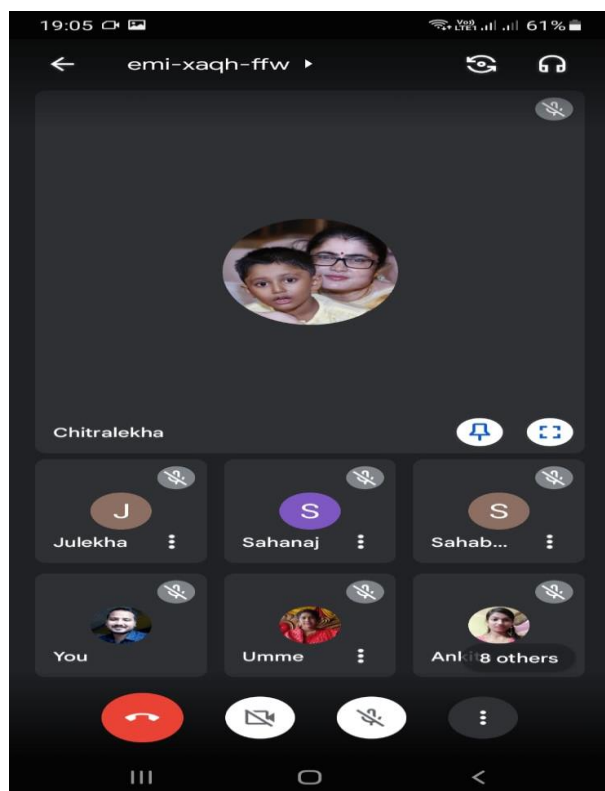

One-day College-level Webinar on *Different types of Feminism* has been organized by the Department of Political Science, S.R. Fatepuria College in collaboration with the Department of Political Science, Hazi A.K. Khan College on 19th March 2022. It has been considered as a part of the MOU which has been signed between these two colleges. This seminar was conducted through online mode via Google Meet. 35 students from both the colleges joined the seminar. Mrs. Chitrlekha Kanjilal, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, Memari College, West Bengal has been invited to deliver a lecture. In her lecture she said through different types of feminism, people gain an understanding of the range of feminisms that have emerged since the 1960s and how their different approaches respond to problems of patriarchy and power. Then Mrs. Kanjilal started to highlight on different types of feminism. For Madam, Liberal Feminism works within the structure of mainstream society to integrate women into it and make it more responsive to individual women’s rights but does not directly challenge the system itself or the ideology behind women’s oppression. Radical feminism views patriarchy and sexism as the most elemental factor in women’s oppression – cutting across all others from race and age to culture, caste and class. It questions the very system and ideology behind

women's subjugation. School of thought which argues that sexism, class oppression, gender identity and racism are inextricably bound together. The way these concepts relate to each other is called intersectionality. Feminists, grounded in Marxist and socialist analysis, attribute women's oppression principally to the capitalist economic system where global corporate power prevails. Many other feminists believe that this form of power seen in the class system is a crucial factor in women's subordination but see patriarchy as the major force behind women's subjugation. Cultural feminism emphasizes essential differences between men and women in terms of biology, personality and behaviour. This form of feminism views patriarchy and its focus on control and domination not only as a source of women's oppression but as being harmful to humanity as well as destructive of all living creatures and the earth itself. After that, our resource person discussed about other branches of feminism. Students have been asked to raise questions after the presentation. Overall, this interactive seminar has effectively benefitted the students.

There are two different types of research papers: primary research and secondary research. The primary research is the study of a subject through first-hand investigation, such as analysing a literary or historical text, a film, a performance, conducting a survey or an interview, or carrying out a laboratory experiment. Primary sources include statistical data, historical documents, and works of literature or art. Secondary research is the examination of studies that other researchers have made on a subject. Examples of secondary

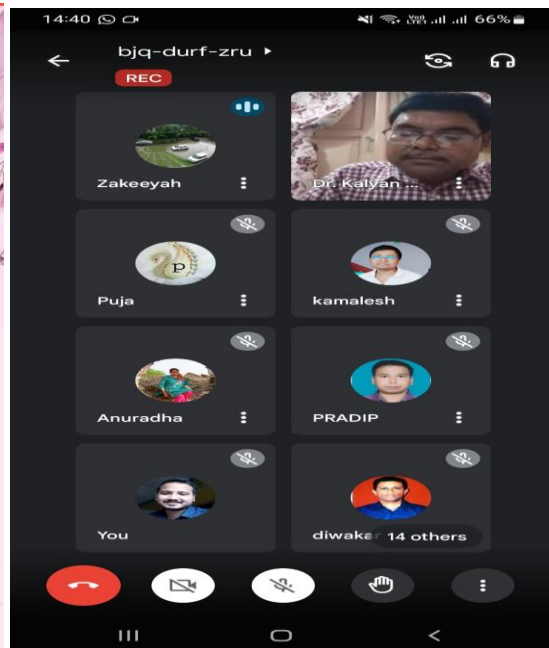
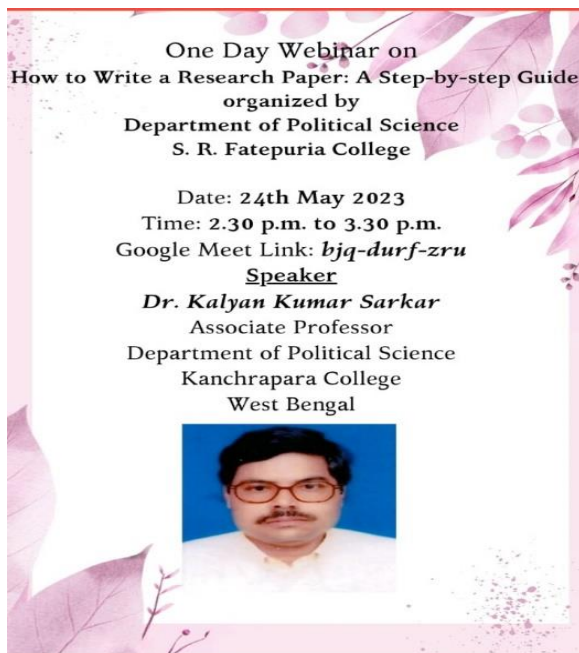
sources are articles and books, scientific debates, or 2 literary works. Writing a research paper is making a contribution to the scientific community. In order for the results of research to be accessible to other professionals and have a potential effect on the scientific community, it must be written and published in suitable journals

Dr Sarkar has said that a Research paper must contain the following sections.

- a. Title
- b. Abstract
- c. Introduction/ Background
- d. Body
- e. Discussion
- f. Conclusion &
- g. Reference.

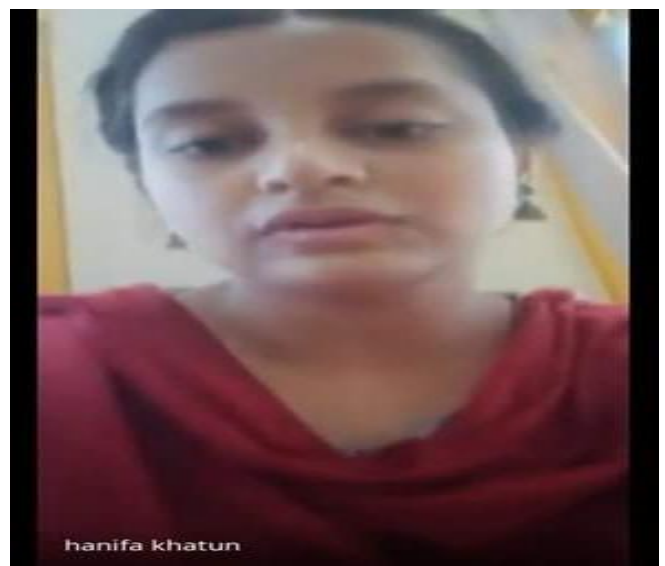
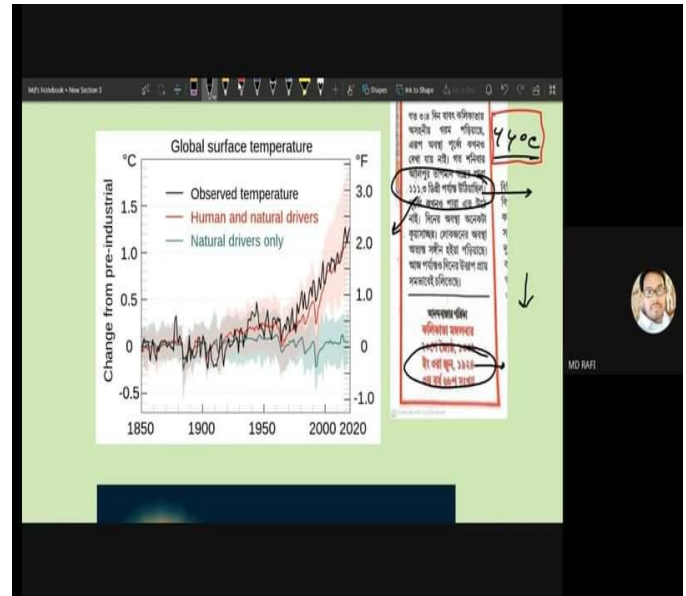
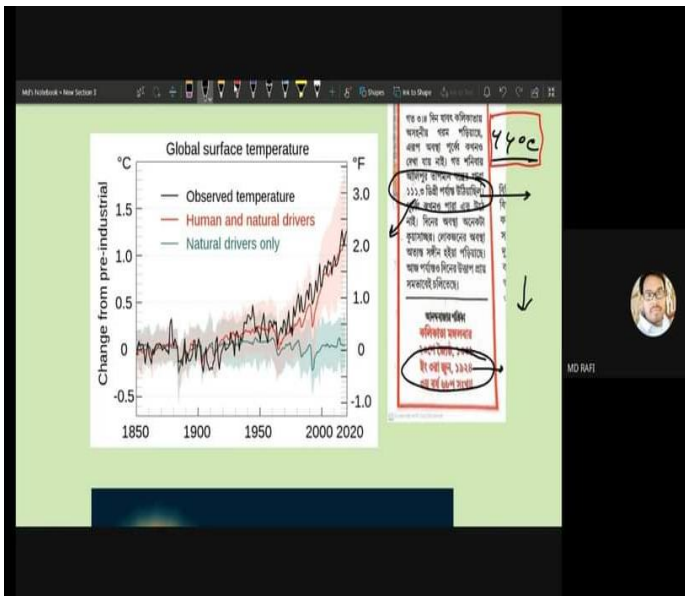
